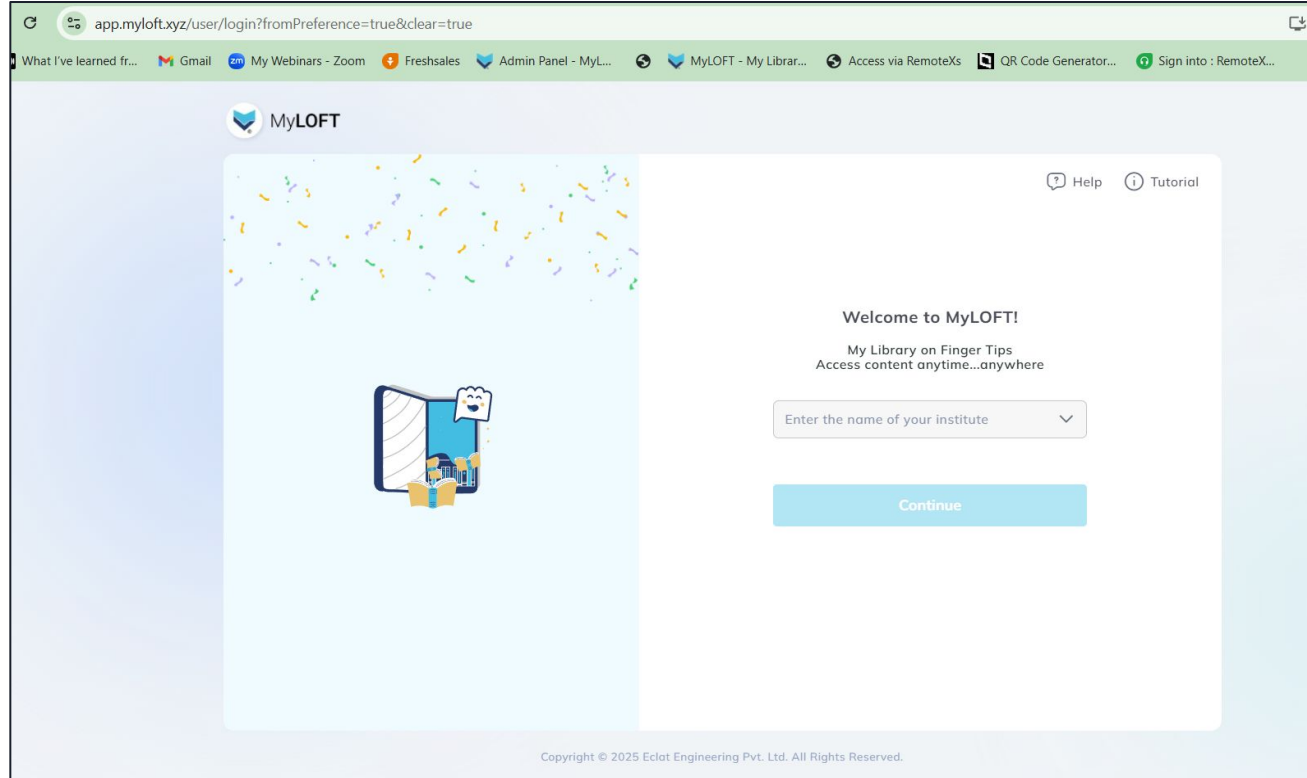

- Choose **your institute** and click '**Continue**'.

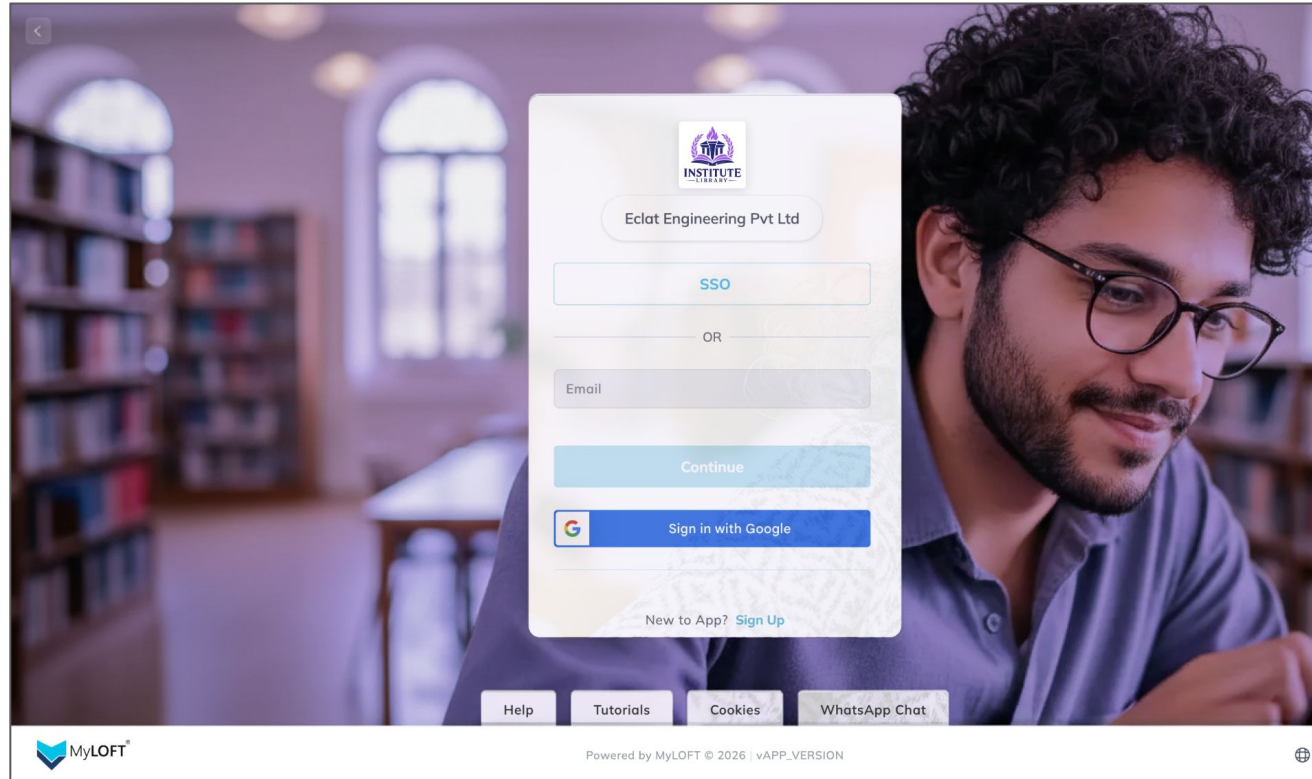


MyLOFT Log In

- Once your account is set up by the library team, you'll receive a **welcome email** from MyLOFT. This email includes a '**Set Password**' button. (If you don't see it in your Inbox, be sure to check your Promotions or SPAM folder.)
- Click on the '**Set Password**' button to open the password setup page, and create a strong password for your MyLOFT account.
- After setting your password, the go to app.myloft.xyz

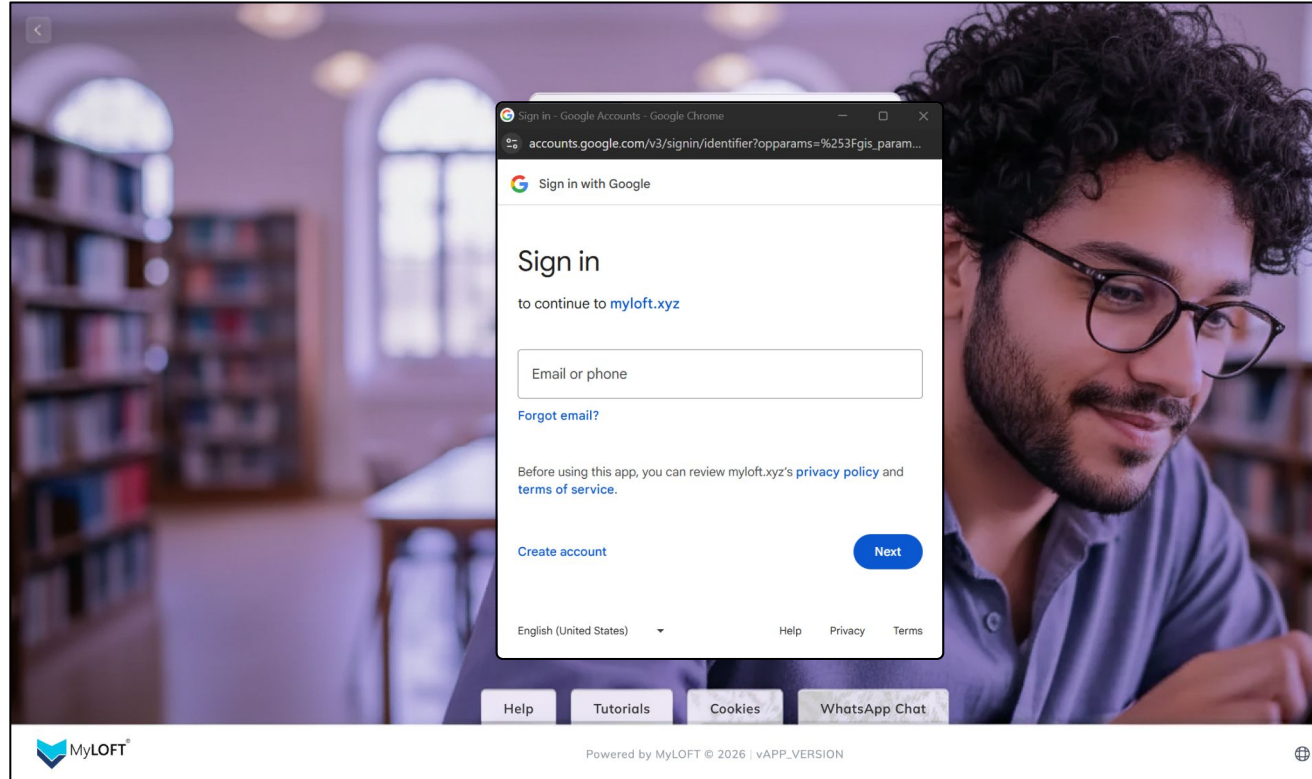
MyLOFT Log In

- Once logged in and the extension is enabled, you can click the logo to access or **save the resource directly**



MyLOFT Home Page: Universal Search

- **Universal Search** enables title-based searches across MyLOFT for eResources (Databases, Journals, eBooks), Open Access articles, and Saved Articles
- Search results can be **filtered and sorted**
- Supports searching via **multiple search engines** directly within the WebApp
- Articles found through search engines can be **saved** for later viewing in the article viewer
